The Wilderness Trace Community Foundation (WTCF) is dedicated to enriching the quality of life for all citizens in the counties of Boyle, Garrad, Lincoln, and Mercer. WTCF serves the charitable interests of donors who have established charitable funds as part of a permanent, collective, philanthropic resource for the current and future needs of the region.

WTCF was organized in 2002 to provide the services of a community foundation to local residents and to begin collective charitable endowment for the Wilderness Trace area.

These endowment funds support local organizations through an annual competitive grantmaking program that has awarded more than \$300,000 since inception. In 2023, the Foundation granted \$40,000 to 21 local nonprofit organizations.

The Wildnerness Trace Community Foundation is an affliate foundation of the Community Foundation of Louisville, a tax-exempt public charity that administers charitable funds created by individuals, businesses, and organizations for the betterment of their communities.
